## CREATING A LOGIN.GOV ACCOUNT

Accessing the Clearinghouse requires the creation of an account with Login.gov. If you do not have a Login.gov account, or would like to create a new one, you will need to follow the steps below.

Login.gov is a safe way to sign in to many U.S. government websites, including the Clearinghouse, using just one account. It helps protect your information by asking you to take extra steps to make sure it's really you when you log in. Login.gov is an official website of the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA).

If you are creating a Login.gov account in order to register for the Clearinghouse, start on the Clearinghouse website. This will automatically bring you back to the Clearinghouse registration process once you are done creating your Login.gov account.

Visit <https://clearinghouse.fmcsa.dot.gov/> and click the **Register** button.

**Create a password.** This password must be at least 12 characters long. If the password you enter is not strong enough, you will not be able to continue. Enter a strong password twice, in the Password and Confirm Password boxes, and click **Continue**.

Select an option to secure your account and click **Continue**.

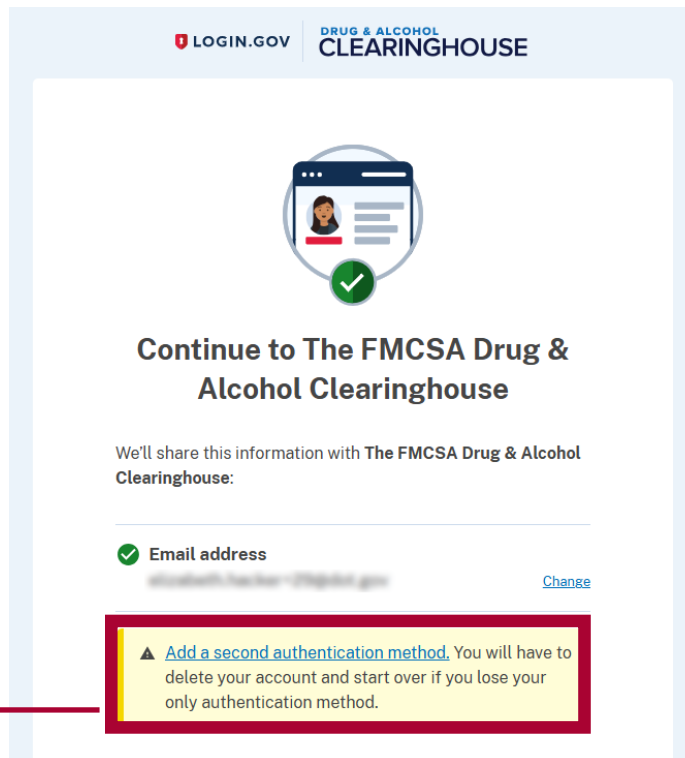
Login.gov requires the completion of a user verification process to ensure the proper person is using those credentials. Follow the instructions for the method you select.

After setting up one authentication method, you have the option to return to the Clearinghouse. You also have the option to set up a second authentication method before proceeding. We strongly recommend you set up this second authentication method now, as it could help avoid issues accessing your Login.gov account in the future.

To set up a second method, click the **Add a second authentication method** link and follow the instructions.

Once you have created both authentication methods, click the **Agree and continue** button to finish creating your Login.gov account. This will return you to the Clearinghouse to begin your Clearinghouse registration.
