SDLA Clearinghouse-II Requirements Recap



Reminder: Clearinghouse-II SDLA Requirements

Mandatory CDL Downgrade

- Remove CLP or CDL privilege within 60 days of being notified by FMCSA of a driver's prohibited status in the Clearinghouse
- If notified by FMCSA that a driver's status changed to "not prohibited"
 - Terminate CLP/CDL privilege removal process; or
 - Reinstate the previouslyremoved CLP/CLP privilege
- If notified by FMCSA that a driver's prohibited status was due to erroneous entry, reinstate as soon as possible and expunge driving record

Non-Issuance

- Query Clearinghouse prior to commercial licensing transaction
- Deny commercial licensing transaction if Clearinghouse query shows driver in a prohibited status
- Commercial licensing transaction = issuing, renewing, transferring, or upgrading a CDL or issuing, renewing, or upgrading a CLP




SDLA Requirements FAQ

• How can an SDLA plan ahead? Is there a way to know how many drivers will be in a "prohibited" status on November 18, 2024?

Yes. SDLAs with Full Access in the Clearinghouse can download the **Prohibited Drivers Report**, which lists all drivers currently in a "prohibited" Clearinghouse status.

Pulling this list regularly over the next few months can help SDLAs estimate how many drivers they will need to downgrade on the compliance date.





SDLA Requirements FAQs (continued)


• If an SDLA begins removing the commercial driving privilege for prohibited drivers ahead of the compliance date, how will the SDLA be notified if the driver's status changes to "not prohibited"?

If the SDLA has established their connection to the Clearinghouse, they will receive notifications from the Clearinghouse based on their State's implementation (e.g., REST service, machine-read emails).

If an SDLA begins removing the commercial driving privilege before they have established connectivity with the Clearinghouse, the SDLA will need to regularly use the manual pull notification—downloading the **Driver Status Change Report** from the Clearinghouse web interface—to ensure they reinstate the commercial driving privilege for drivers whose statuses change to "not prohibited" after completing their RTD process (or due to erroneous entry).

 - Make sure you have requested Full Access (instructions are in the "Using the Clearinghouse User Interface" job aid)



SDLA Requirements FAQs (continued)

• If an SDLA pulls a Prohibited Drivers Report or Driver Status Change Report before the compliance date, does the 60-day requirement apply?

No. FMCSA does not plan to enforce this 60-day requirement before the November 18, 2024 compliance date. However, the 60-day requirement would apply to any driver information that is pulled on or after November 18, 2024.



Tip: Start by downgrading drivers that have been in a prohibited status for the longest amount of time. This will clear the backlog of drivers that are least likely to be working through an RTD process.

Get Ahead of the Compliance Date

- Obtain legislative authority.
- Download Prohibited Driver Report.
- 3. Identify your State's process for removing commercial driving privilege for drivers in "prohibited" Clearinghouse status.
- 4. Begin removing commercial driving privileges, starting with driver's in "prohibited" status for the longest time.
- 5. Download the Driver Status Change Report regularly, reinstate commercial driving privilege as needed.

Direct Connect to the Clearinghouse

States have the option to establish a direct connection between their State IT system and the Clearinghouse. The guide below provides the information States will need to set up this connection.

- View the service Swagger UI Document
- NOW AVAILABLE: Interconnection Security Agreement (ISA), which is required for connecting State IT systems with the Clearinghouse. To request the ISA, contact SDLAclearinghouse@dot.gov.


